Message from [Kurt Bluemel](#)

Summer is ending and growers' minds turn quickly to the next season. It is in our nature to think of the future. Planting a seed, a plug, a garden is an exercise in the belief of tomorrow. We meticulously plan for today to ensure that we will have something beautiful tomorrow.



I have planned my entire nursery around the chance to grow a long-list of varieties to have blooming or flushing every day. I am less concerned about seasons than most. I point my attention towards weeks within a month. What will I have blooming in February or in June or in October and what structure will each of those things have in December?

Fall, for example, has about 90 days of opportunity for your customers to have at least one new experience in the garden a day. Planning the 4-season-interest garden can often leave gaps and lulls especially in late fall when things have gone to seed or have been cut back if you don't plan well.

The plant selections for my landscape designs have always been based on the theory that every day can be new in the garden. Always a discovery to be made. Always a grass flushing or perennial blooming. I make my plant selections based on the hardiest and the most unique plant material available and look in my collection to see where that bloom time fits.

So this "fall" or 90 days of opportunity, choose variable plants that will bloom in the beginning, the middle and the end of the season. Then, try to extend your garden designs to provide interest for 365 days.
